FACTS

1. The Attorney General of Canada appears as an intervenor pursuant to the Order of the Right Honourable the Chief Justice of Canada dated July 2, 1985 fixing the constitutional question herein.

PART II

POINTS IN ISSUE

- 2. The questions stated by the Right Honourable the Chief Justice are:
 - 1. Does The Dairy Workers (Maintenance of Operations) Act, S.S. 1984, c. D-1.1, or any part thereof, infringe or deny freedom of association guaranteed in s. 2(d) of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms.?
 - 2. If The Dairy Workers
 (Maintenance of Operations) Act,
 S.S. 1984, c. D-1.1, or any part
 thereof, infringe or deny freedom
 of association guaranteed in s.
 2(d) of the Canadian Charter of
 Rights and Freedoms, is the Act, or
 such part, justified by s. 1 of the
 Canadian Charter of Rights and
 Freedoms and therefore not
 inconsistent with the Constitution
 Act, 1982?

The Attorney General of Canada submits that the first question should be answered in the affirmative. If the Court should find it necessary to answer the second question he has no submissions to make with respect thereto.

PART III

ARGUMENT

- The issue raised by the first question in this appeal is essentially that which is before this Honourable Court in <u>Public Service Alliance of Canada v. The Queen.</u> The Attorney General of Canada will therefore rely upon the submissions in paragraphs 3 to 28 of his factum filed in that appeal as being applicable to the first question.
- 4. The Attorney General has no submissions to make with respect to the second question.

PART IV

ORDER SOUGHT

5. It is submitted that the first question should be answered in the negative and that the appeal herein should be allowed and the Order of Sirois J. restored.
